

Otoro Noun Classes

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This document outlines the Otoro noun classes. The noun classes are identified by their singular and plural prefixes and by their concords and are summarised in the chart below. The noun class numbering used is that given by Stevenson 1956. Where there are 2 numbers for a noun class, the first number gives the singular form, and the second the plural form. Zero prefixes are indicated by Ø. The concord agreement prefixes are not included because they have not yet been investigated. However in most cases, these will be the same as the noun class prefixes. The analysis is based on a list of about 125 nouns.

Class Distinctions

This analysis corresponds closely to that given by Stevenson, and in many cases we have defaulted to Stevenson's analysis because of the lack of data, and because of similarity with other related languages. However some comments can be made:

- The long things and dangerous things classes seem very mixed.
- The class labeled 'various' was not found by Stevenson. We only have 4 words in this class, but it is included because it appears in other Heiban group languages.
